

## CURRICULAR REQUIREMENTS

Admission to the Biodiversity, Conservation and Environmental Quality (BCEQ) master's degree (MD) is subject to the possession of a three-year university degree or diploma, or other qualification acquired abroad and recognized as suitable. To be admitted to the BCEQ MD it is necessary to have certain curricular requirements and adequate personal preparation.

The curricular requirements for admission are satisfied with the possession of a degree in one of the following classes of the D.M. 270/2004 (or corresponding in the former Ministerial Decree 509/99):

L-13 (Biological Sciences)

L-32 (Science and Technology for the Environment and Nature)

L-2 (Biotechnology).

Admission is also permitted with the possession of a suitable qualification in a degree class other than those specified above, provided that the following have been achieved:

a) at least 66 credits in the basic biological disciplines (BIO / 01, BIO / 02, BIO / 04, BIO / 05, BIO / 06, BIO / 07, BIO / 09, BIO / 10, BIO / 11, BIO / 18 , BIO / 19), 12 CFU in the basic chemical disciplines (CHIM / 01, CHIM / 02, CHIM / 03, CHIM / 06), and 15 CFU in the basic mathematical, physical and computer disciplines (MAT / 01-09, FIS / 01-08 and INF / 01), in accordance with the guidelines of the CBUI (College of Biologists of the Italian Universities);

b) a degree mark of not less than 100/110

**For graduates from foreign universities, the adequacy of the curricular requirements is assessed on a case-by-case basis on the consistency between the programs carried out in the various subject areas, the training foundations deemed necessary for the advanced training offered by the course of study, as well as the adequate knowledge of the English language.**

It is also required to have the certification of knowledge of the English language at level B2 of the common European framework of reference for languages of the European Council.

For foreign students, a verification of adequate knowledge of the Italian language is required. Students who do not possess these language skills will have to attend specific courses to reach the required level, as part of further training activities.

Verification of the adequacy of the personal preparation

Verification of the personal preparation is compulsory and will be carried out by means of a test or interview, in the manner prescribed by the didactic regulations of the course of study.

Graduates in possession of the curricular requirements, who have obtained the qualification with a grade of not less than 95/110 will be exempt from this test, as they are recognized as possessing adequate preparation.
